

Senate

This year, Senate...

- ► Academic Affairs committee passed the Academic Notification of Credit Limit Bill, Senator Early Class Registration and added a search bar in Canelink to enhance student resource navigation
- ► University Affairs committee passed a resolution to implement a status tracker on the JOBX student employment user dashboard page, a resolution to protect UM's diverse student body, educational opportunities and against future attempts of limiting these student rights from Florida House bills 999,931 and 599 and added emergency epipens to all residence halls, dorms, libraries and wellness center
- ► Public Relations Committee participated in a Skin Care Giveaway, Study Break: Midterms Edition with Outreach, Meet Your Senator Brunch Edition and a Fall basket giveaway to increase student interaction and awareness
- ▶ Policy and Finance Committee provided funds for ALAS Hispanic Heritage Month, Homecoming, Black Leaders for the Queer Community, COISO International Dance Competition, AASA Lunar New Year, Hairology, HP 'Canes Carnival, FEC Week of Cuban Culture, Distraction Magazine, NAACP, Muslim Students of UM









Supreme Court

The Supreme Court is the judicial branch of the University of Miami Student Government. It consists of one Chief Justice, eight Associate Justices and a Clerk of the Court. It addresses cases and appeals pertaining to the Student Government and upholds the provisions and powers of the Student Government Constitution and Statutes. Its main focus is ensuring ethical and unbiased conduct between all.



This year, SC...

- ► Organizational Seat Reviews, 7 organizations applied. 4 were seatrenewalsand3organizations applied to be granted a seat in the Senate (NOW, ASU, and Disability Ambassadors). Court voted unanimously to approve all 7 applications after conducting hearings with each organization.
- ▶ the first Spring Election Season in at least 5 years to yield no Elections Trials for the Supreme Court
- ► Increased collaboration and communication between Court and Senate leadership.











External Advisor to the President

A role established this year, the Executive External Advisor to the President, gathers student concerns from uncontacted parts of campus, consults for the university, builds initiatives for improving campus life, and finds out of the box solutions to problems. In the past two semesters, the Executive External Advisor to the President consulted with several student organizations including HP, Kappa Theta Pi, Model United Nations and Iron Arrow on initiatives, areas for improvement and more.





This year, EAP...

- ► Founded Lift Off Leaders, an initiative co-founded with President Boyd, that works in tandem with the Launch Pad at the University of Miami to connect entrepreneurially minded students, expose them to vetted CEOs, and teach skills through educational workshops
- Program, a three-tier program meant to unite the top talent in marketing students through training, educational programs, and job-site tours. The first tier is a Q&A panel that will take place at 8:00 PM on April 3rd where they will speak to the Global Head of HR of Johnson & Johnson, the CCO of Sunny Park Beverages, and the Global Head of Brand WhatsApp.
- Founded the Leaders of Tomorrow Initiative LTI). This peer-to-peer networking program connects the top students from a variety of different disciplines, fields, and professions to foster connections, expose them to exclusive educational opportunities, provide them with mentors and introduce them to notable alumni. LTI has met with CEO of Bose, Lila Snyder, Antonio Mora, four-time Emmy Award Winner and former anchor of Good Morning America.












Academic Liaison Council

The liaisons serve as points of contact between different academic areas and Student Government. They work to facilitate and coordinate an overall understanding of all the current academic projects and initiatives within SG.

This year, ALC...

- ► Continued assisting with the implementation of the Foote Fellows Honors Program Opt-In legislation that will allow students in their first semesters at the University to apply to become Foote Fellows.
- ► Through the Miller School of Medicine Transportation Initiative, Metrorail passes were
 - ordered for students participating in research-for-credit at the Miller School of Medicine Campus.
- Successfully held an event for junior nursing students on how to approach the transition into Nursing School.
 They intend to establish this series of events for every year in the Nursing School.
- Successfully continued and expanded the mentorship program for undergraduate prelaw students and had excellent turnout for the Fall 2023 Pre-Law Mentorship Program Lunch.



- Advocated for early registration for PRISM students
- ► Created a database where student athletes and coaches can easily look for classes the student needs to take and how to organize the semester to work with training and other responsibilities.
- ► Contributed to the plans to renovate a room in the Ashe Building into a student-friendly space.
- ► Re-established the University Registrar liaison position.
- ► Revised UGalapagos Program which reviewed the admission process and added graduation stoles for those who complete the program.
- Collaborated with ESC and COP for Engineering week

- ► Assisted with the renovation of both Richter Library and the Herbert Wellness Center.
- ► Expanded the parking space sizes in the Red Lot
- ► Installed menstrual hygiene product dispensers in the UC, Murphy Design Studio, and Cox Science. (In progress but has already been approved)
- Worked with facilities to ensure that menstrual product dispensers are regularly refilled
- ► Changed the types of trash bins in Eaton Residential college to make it easier for students










Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Council

- ► Collaborated with AGLO for the LOTUS House Service Day, where students filled care packages with sanitary products and toys for women and children.












First-Year Leadership Council

This year, FLC...

- ► FLC Programming and Yearbook: This project is in charge of hosting internal events and activities to boost morale and encourage bonding amongst the council's members. This committee hosted a beginning-ofthe-year retreat, a Friendsgiving day event, and organized a Winter break party. This semester, they will be hosting a FLC field day and a lock-in. Programming also has been working on a yearbook and merchandise to reflect our achievements and memories during the year.
- Proposed by an FLC member, the goal of this project was to talk to faculty and different organizations on campus to learn about facilities and existing programs pertaining to Women's rights.
- Sustainability Project: Initiatives included conducting chlorine testing on the different water sources on campus as well as minimizing the plastic waste within Corner Deli
- With guest speakers including Pat Whitley and Dean Holmes, the summit provided the attendees with free Chipotle, sweatshirts, and headshots. The sessions offered included "Intrepreneurship" by

- LaunchPad, Funding by SAFAC, Conflict Resolution by LTI's Andres Concha, Engagement for Your Club by HP, and Marketing/Networking Yourself by Niles Niseem. We were able to raise \$3800 in funds, and were able to host 68 attendees at the event itself.
- ► SG Did That Week: A series of events celebrating the achievement that SG has contributed to the university across the decades.
- Academic Feedback Channel: The annual survey collects the academic experience of students and shares results with the Deans.
- ▶ SG Gives Back: Hosted a Chick-Fil-A fundraiser to raise over \$400 for Nicklaus Children's Hospital and their toy drive.




This year, Outreach...


violations to the Supreme
